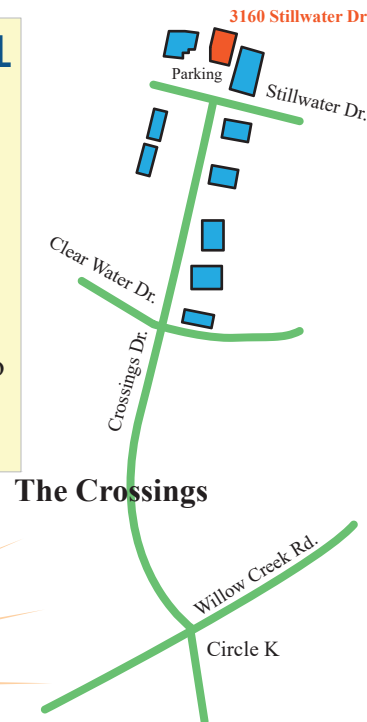

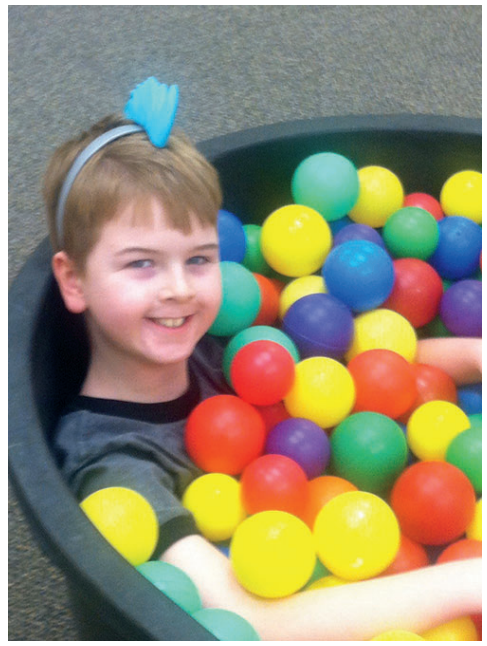
## THERAPY SERVICES

(All ages - infant to adult)

We provide speech, occupational, and physical therapy to all ages. Our licensed therapists are able to perform evaluations and provide ongoing therapy services to those who qualify.

Therapies can be provided in various locations depending on availability.

We accept private pay and are contracted with most insurance companies, including AHCCSS, as well as the AZ Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD).



## FAMILY SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS PROGRAM A.K.A. LITTLE LEARNERS PROGRAM

(Birth through age 5)

**NOW ENROLLING!**

This program promotes physical, social, and emotional developmental support among children with special needs who do not qualify for early intervention services or preschool special education services.

The Little Learners Program provides targeted support for the parents and/or caregivers of special needs children.

The expected result is that families will have access to knowledge and support needed to address developmental concerns they may have for their child.

Services are delivered through home visits and developmental play groups.

## FIRST THINGS FIRST

Support for Family Support for Children with Special Needs is provided by a grant from First Things First, which partners with families and communities to give all Arizona children the opportunity to arrive at kindergarten healthy and ready to succeed.

## LITTLE LEARNERS PROGRAM (CONT.)

Specifically designed for children needing just a little bit of help.

- Direct and indirect therapies.
- Includes developmental play groups.
- Parent education & collaboration.
- Visits take place in the home.
- No charge to parents.
- No income qualifications.

If parents are not sure if a child may qualify, we will be happy to perform a free assessment. Services are limited to Yavapai County families.

As part of the Little Learners Program, HCEI offers play groups for children.
